B.S. EDUCATION: EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Transfer Single Articulation Pathway (TSAP)

This program is only available to students who began the Associate of Science in Education at Ivy Tech Community College or Vincennes University in fall 2015 or later and have completed the A.S. in Education. A total of 60 credits is required to graduate.

The Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education leads to a license to teach infant/toddler preschool programs and grades K-3 with an emphasis in child development, family-centered practices, and special education. Graduates are prepared to be P/K-3rd grade teachers in inclusive classrooms, to teach in preschool special education, for positions within agencies and organizations that serve young children and their families, and for working in Indiana's First Steps system in early intervention and developmental therapy. The following are required for retention, student teaching and graduation: a 2.0 GPA in each content area; a 2.5 GPA in the Professional Education and overall; and a grade of C or higher in each professional education course.

PREREQUISITES FOR ADMISSION TO THE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM (TEP)

Competitive enrollment. Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee enrollment in authorized courses.

1. Official student transcript verifying completion of the TSAP in Early Childhood Education and the STGEC at ITCC or VU must be received by the IU Bloomington Office of Admissions prior to July 1.
2. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 at ITCC or VU
3. No grade lower than a C at ITCC or VU
4. Apply to IUB by June 1 to begin in Fall Term.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

60 credits/2.5 GPA

A grade of C or higher is required in each EDUC course.

Courses must be taken in prescribed blocks. Successful completion (C or higher grade) of all courses in each block is a prerequisite for the next block and student teaching. Blocks must be completed in sequence from one semester to the next. Courses listed below must be successfully completed on the Bloomington campus prior to student teaching.
