B.S. EDUCATION: COMMUNITY OF TEACHERS (CoT)

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This Bachelor of Science in Education degree enables you to teach specific content fields in the All-Grades (Grades P-12), Middle School/Junior High or High School (Grades 5-12) setting. Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin. A four-year college plan requires completion of 15 credits each semester. A 2.5 GPA overall is required for retention and graduation. A total of 120 credits is required for graduation.

- 21 credits and a 2.5 GPA in the content field (exception: Math 2.0 GPA) with at least 15 credits completed and 6 credits in progress.
