CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH MINOR (NON-TEACHING)

The Child and Adolescent Mental Health Minor will introduce students to content related to the mental health needs and development of children and adolescents. It is designed for students interested in education, psychology, medicine, social work and public health who want to focus their career aspirations on children and adolescents. Those pursuing the minor will develop the skills necessary to successfully integrate the knowledge of child and adolescent mental health into their service/profession as it relates to the social and cultural context of mental health, mental illness, diagnosis and treatment.

This minor does not lead to a license to practice professional counseling or licensure in any other professional helping field.

- NOTE:**
- Students must complete 15 credits for the minor. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher. Courses must average a minimum of 2.0 overall to earn the minor.
 - Minimum of 9 hours must be at the 300 or 400 level.
 - Required Introductory Courses (EDUC-G 208, EDUC-G 375, EDUC-K 343, EDUC-P 248, EDUC-P 313, and EDUC-P 314) can be taken in advance of taking EDUC-P 225 (or concurrently).
 - Only one (1) course may double count for both a license addition and an academic minor.
 - Only one (1) education course may overlap between an education program and an academic minor.
 - No course overlap is allowed between academic minors and/or certificates. (For example, EDUC-G 203 cannot be used to fulfill a requirement in both the Counseling minor and the Educational Studies minor.)
