B.S. EDUCATION: WORLD LANGUAGE (LATIN)

This Bachelor of Science in Education degree enables you to teach All-Grades (K-12). Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin. A four-year college plan requires completion of 15 credits each semester. A 2.5 GPA overall is required for retention and graduation. A total of 120 credits are required for graduation.

PREREQUISITES FOR ADMISSION TO THE TEP

Competitive enrollment. Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee enrollment in authorized courses.

- Complete the basic skills testing requirement by using any of the following options:
 - Qualifying scores on CASA Reading 220, Math 220, Writing 220
 - SAT combined MA+VE score of at least 1100 if test taken prior to March 1, 2016
 - SAT combined MA+VE score of at least 1170 if test taken on or after March 1, 2016
 - ACT composite score of at least 24

Sum of EN + MA + RE + SR scores divided by 4 = 24

- 2. 2.5 GPA overall.
- 21 credits and a 2.5 GPA in the content field with at least 15 credits completed and 6 credits in progress. Grade of C minus (C-) or higher is required in each content field course.
- 4. Completion of or enrollment in prerequisites: Grade of C or higher is required in each EDUC course.
