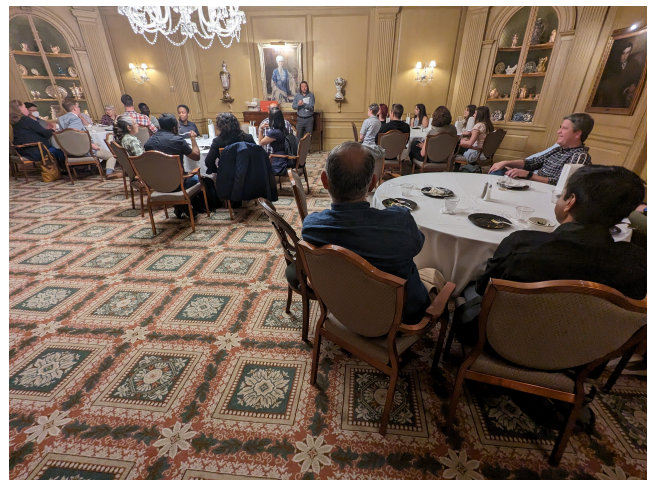

Hobbies: include watching movies, cooking, and spending time with pets.

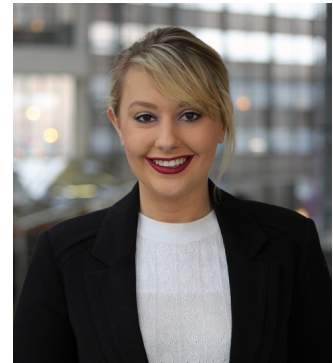

Department of Geography Undergraduate Student Research Grant and IU Day

We are getting ready for IU Day 2023, and this year's funding efforts will go towards the IUB Undergraduate Research Scholarship.

This year's recipients of our undergraduate scholarship illustrate the important and vital research being done by our undergrads in Geography at IU Bloomington.

Samantha Hash - Samantha Hash's project, *Defining the lived experience of hunger and precarity through food access barriers on IU Bloomington's Campus*, examines food insecurity amongst students. Supervised by Dr. Olga Kalentzidou, Samantha plans to create a survey and conduct focus group interviews to understand the reasons for food insecurity and how it is experienced by students at IU Bloomington.

Sydney Foreman - Sydney Foreman's project, *Seed markets, climate change, and decision making in Zambia*, develops decision support tools for Zambian smallholder farmers. Supervised by Dr. Kurt Waldman, and in collaboration with students and faculty at the University of Zambia, Sydney's research project will collect yield data, field boundaries, and household survey data to better understand how extreme weather events are impacting farmer's seed selection and sowing choices.

Emily Hughes: Emily Hughes' project, *The Gods that Loom Above Wealth Distribution in Rural Illinois*, examines the lives of those in rural poverty versus the middle-class in Central and Southern Illinois. Supervised by Dr. Ishan Ashutosh, Emily's project will aim to understand how the rural poor are represented, and how to challenge these accounts by researching how the rural poor thrive despite living lives represented as undesirable.

Nick Angelos and Sidd Das -Nick Angelos' and Sidd Das' project, *Resource Distribution for the Unhoused Community in Indiana Cities*, will map and analyze resources available to unhoused communities in the cities of Bloomington, Evansville, and Indianapolis. Supervised by Dr. Yuri Kim, Nick and Sidd anticipate presenting their research at the 2023 Indiana GIS Conference
