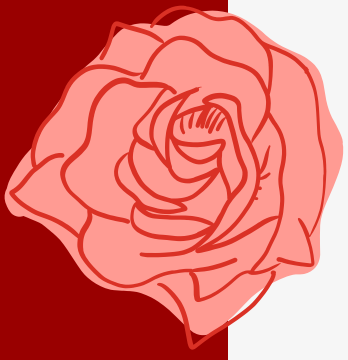

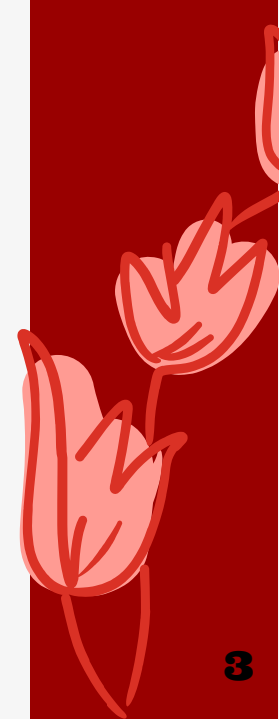
WILLIAM R. BLACK LEADERSHIP MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

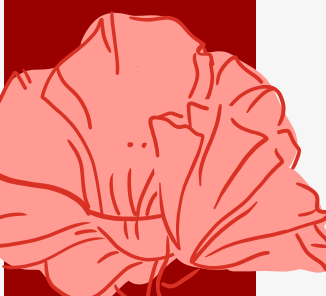
