This month's tip: Assemble your team!

We'll let you in on a little secret: The key to success as an adult isn't necessarily being able to be completely independent. Rather, it's having a support team with the right players. Make sure you invite people on your team who "get you," who you can trust, who have time, and who are capable or who have special talents. For instance, your

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team may include your friend who can teach you how to download and use helpful apps; your cousin who will drive you to work; a friend of your mother's who understands money, funding, and benefits issues; your parents; and a therapist you used to work with who is great at helping you make decisions.
