 - Created the Perkins V CTE
 Concentrator Course
 Sequences in December.

Graduation Pathways CTE Concentrator:

A student who has completed at least two advanced courses with a C average in a single career and technical program or program of study.





Perkins V Pathways FAQ


- Where can I find CTE pathways?
- A student must complete one course from CTE Concentrator A and one from CTE Concentrator B
- Required prerequisites must be followed
- WBL does not count as a concentrator course


