Indiana's Foreign-Born Population 2005 Estimates

An estimated 242,000 persons in Indiana are foreign born, according to 2005 estimates from the Census Bureau.

That number comprises 4 percent of our household population in the state.

Of these, 80,000 were naturalized citizens although the majority (161,942) were not U.S. citizens.





Top Ten Birth Countries – 2005 Estimates




